After a disappointing second-place finish at last year's Greek Week, the chapter realigned and took home numerous awards at last year's annual Highlander Awards. This semester, Beta Alpha has gotten off to a strong start in terms of its philanthropic achievement, raising over 1400\$ for the ability experience as well as other Philanthropic initiatives. As a fraternity, we take immense pride in our fundraising initiatives for The Ability Experience. Currently, we've successfully generated over \$4,300 during the 2023 calendar out of the \$6,450 required to attain gold society status like the previous year. Our dedicated efforts over the past year reflect our commitment to this cause, and we are persistently working towards reaching our goal. During the Spring semester, we accomplished an impressive fundraising total of over \$3,000. The highlight of our philanthropic events was the successful War of the Roses, skillfully organized by our former philanthropy chairman, Brother Mohammed Udin BA 943. Additionally, we hosted Pi-a-PiKapp that yielded over \$600. A noteworthy long-term investment made by our chapter was the acquisition of a slushie machine. Throughout the semester, we set up tables multiple times, selling slushies and directing all proceeds towards The Ability Experience. Our fundraising endeavors extended further, including selling brownies, Krispy Kreme donuts, cup cakes, and a Valentine's Day bake sale in collaboration with a sorority on campus, Delta Phi Epsilon.

In the ongoing Fall semester, we've successfully raised over \$1,350 through various initiatives. The highlight of our philanthropic endeavors this term was the Pi-a-PiKapp event. Similar to the previous semester, we continued the sale of slushies in the campus center and offered brownies. The standout event this semester has been Pie-A-PiKapp, where family, friends, and classmates contribute funds to The Ability Experience, allowing them to pie a Pi Kappa Phi brother in the face with shaving cream. Our well-known 48-hour bike-a-thon which hasn't been held since last Fall, is yet to take place this semester. I hope to live the rest of my life like John does chasing my passion regardless of what roadblocks are put in my way and without Gear Up Florida I never would have been able to help John or any of the other hundreds of people we did and for that I am beyond grateful.


